

How to Find Exhibition Reviews?

Art Full Text and Art Retrospective :

From the "Document Type" drop-down menu select "Exhibit" or "Review Article"

• LexisNexis Academic:

Select tab for News. Use keyword "Art Review" combined with your search term to return results. Limit the date range by using the field for Specify date.

• JSTOR:

Coverage at NJIT varies, but you can get some samples of exhibition reviews by searching this database.

• Academic Search Premier:

Use Boolean operators to combine a particular exhibition title with the word "exhibition" in a subject field, for example:



• Omni File Full Text Mega Edition:

From the "Document Type" drop-down menu select "Exhibit" or "Review Article"
